YOUTH THEATRE



Kiln's Youth Theatre provides free weekly sessions for young people aged 12–15 who live or attend school in Brent. Across the programme, participants work with a team of guest artists and practitioners to develop their performance skills

through drama-based exercises and activities. The young people collaborate with practitioners to devise theatre, film, and audio performances which are shared in front of an invited audience.

YOUNG COMPANY



Kiln's Young Company provides free weekly sessions for young people aged 16–18 who live or learn in Brent. Each session supports participants to build their confidence and creative skills through a variety of exercises

and activities, whilst also enabling connection through a shared love of drama.

Over the course of the programme, the participants work with a playwright and a professional creative team to devise and perform a full-scale production which explores matters of importance to them and the communities they are a part of. The creative process aims to be reflective of professional industry practice, giving further insight into theatre making, should participants want to pursue creative careers further.
