

## What is it?

The Youth Explainer Programme is a year-long science communication programme. You will work as a team to design bespoke nature-inspired tabletop games based on the plants in Kew's glasshouses. You will then volunteer in the glasshouses. using your games to educate the public and inspire visitors to care and learn more about the important conservation work that happens here.

- Gain your volunteering and skills sections of your Duke of Edinburgh award.
- Gain a Kew Young Environmental Leaders Award.
- Develop your confidence and communication skills.
- Develop your knowledge of the natural world.
- Go behind the scenes in the Gardens and discover how Kew scientists work to conserve threatened plants and fungi.
- Have your own Kew-inspired board game professionally produced.
- Meet like-minded people and make new friends.

- Volunteering sessions: 10–12 sessions on Saturdays between April and September, 10.30am – 3pm.
