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

Social Care and Further Education Pathways is a free, voluntary service, which aims to support young people and adults with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) to improve their wellbeing and find meaningful employment. We also provide support for SEND students in colleges to transition into working life.

To be eligible for the programme, you must be:

- Over 18 years old with SEND or a social care need, or be a carer or family member of someone with these needs
- Living in Barnet, Brent, Ealing, Hammersmith & Fulham, Harrow, Hillingdon or Hounslow
- Not in work

Our team of Community Link Workers make sure you have access to the widest possible range of support and services to meet your needs and our team of Employment Advisers will support you to find the right job fit and assess what impact employment will have on your benefits and finances.

You can opt out of the service at any time, if you feel it is not right for you.

When you access employment support your Employment Adviser will:

- Get to know you and your specific needs and requirements
- Create a realistic employment plan based on your needs and what you want to do
- Help prepare your tailored CV
- Job search and engage with employers
- Provide advice on welfare benefits and how these could be affected by going into work
- Provide advice and on-going in-work support
- Support you to create an in-work action plan

Your dedicated Employment Adviser will provide you with practical and emotional support to help you on your journey back in to work.
