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Fire Marshal

Summary:

The Fire Marshal will be responsible for managing all fire safety measures related to my client's roofing and associated works on the Mace project. This includes overseeing and monitoring hot works operations, ensuring full compliance with hot works permit procedures, and carrying out fire watch duties using thermal imaging equipment. The role is essential in making sure all activities meet Mace's fire strategy requirements as well as statutory fire safety regulations.

Key Responsibilities:

- Manage the hot works permit process for all BriggsAmasco works:
- Apply for and issue hot works permits
- Ensure all control measures are implemented prior to works commencing
- Close out permits upon completion of works
- Conduct continuous fire watch duties during live hot works:
- Be present throughout all hot works activities
- Monitor work area during and after hot works, including the mandatory 60-minute post-completion watch followed by additional periodic checks (20-minute intervals for a further 60 minutes)
- Operate digital thermal imaging equipment to monitor heat levels:
- Take and record readings before, during and after hot works
- Provide real-time reporting to the BriggsAmasco Supervisor and Mace Fire Manager as required
- Verify that fire extinguishers and suppression equipment are available, in place and ready for use prior to any hot works.
- Raise the alarm and safely tackle any incipient fires, following site emergency procedures.
- Ensure all fire routes, exits, and assembly points are known, accessible and comply with Mace fire strategy.
- Maintain accurate fire watch records, permit logs, and thermal imaging records for audit purposes.
- Attend site fire safety briefings, toolbox talks and ensure full compliance with Mace site rules and fire management protocols.
- Liaise directly with BriggsAmasco management, the Mace Fire Team and other key stakeholders as required.

Essential Requirements:

- Fire Marshal / Fire Warden certificate (valid and up to date)
- BriggsAmasco Hot Works and Fire Watch training (provided if required)
- Experience performing fire watch or hot works supervision (roofing/construction sector preferred)
- Familiarity with hot works procedures, fire permits, and permit-to-work systems
- Competent in using digital thermal imaging equipment (training will be provided if necessary)
- Ability to follow strict procedural controls and escalation protocols
- Physically fit to perform regular patrols and remain standing for extended periods
- Excellent attention to detail and safety awareness
- Strong communication skills to liaise with operatives, supervisors, and management
